

The Hereford Diocesan Guild of Bellingers Bell Restoration Fund

The **Bell Restoration Fund** (BRF) was constituted in its present form on Spring Bank Holiday Monday in 1976. Two years later it became a Registered Charity (No. 508531) and, although closely associated with the Hereford Diocesan Guild of Bellingers (the Guild), it is administered independently of the Guild itself.

Since 1976 the Fund has distributed grants totalling **£108,532** towards the cost of bell restoration work in its affiliated towers. Its most recent awards have been to restoration, augmentation and maintenance projects at **Goodrich, Ludlow, Bromyard, Eastnor and Morville**.

The BRF's income comes from donations, bequests and fund-raising events organised by the Districts of the Guild, affiliation fees paid by member churches and interest earned from its investments. Each District of the Guild appoints its own Fund-Raising Representative to co-ordinate fund-raising efforts and the work they do is greatly appreciated by the Fund's Trustees and Officers, as is the hard work and generosity of so many members of the Guild itself.

Originally all parishes within the Diocese of Hereford, and a small number outside the Diocese with a long history of membership of the Guild, with five bells or more were invited to become members of the BRF. More recently churches with fewer than five bells have been welcomed as members as well. Currently 118 churches are affiliated to the BRF.

The BRF is able to assist projects to restore bells so that they can be rung full circle. When determining the availability and amount of grants the Committee takes into account the church's history of membership of the Fund. At the present time it is prepared to consider offering grants of up to 20% of the eligible cost of the project. Payment of grants is made following satisfactory completion of the work.

Any church with bells in the Hereford Diocese may affiliate to the BRF by paying an affiliation fee, currently £2 per ringing bell per annum, due on 1st January. If payment is not received by March 31st membership is deemed to be in arrears; for this reason payment by Standing Order is strongly encouraged.

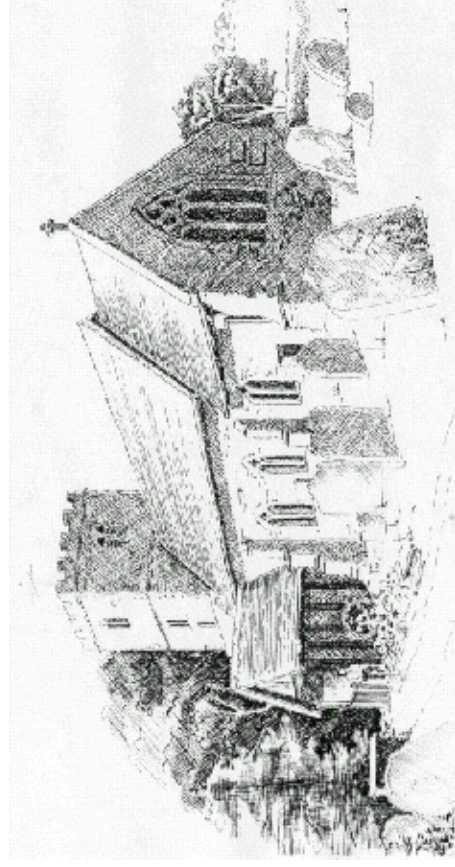
